Garfield Bulldogs (5-14) VS Stadium Tigers (15-2)

Wins and Losses, past now future!

Metro conference games are NOW history, no changes. The Bulldogs are anticipating all their potential in the upcoming Post- Conference games (Playing Baseball), but we have "today"! The Tigers come roaring in with only 2 losses to the Kangaroos and Seahawks and are looking to get back on track against our Bulldogs after taking their most recent loss this past Saturday.

Post- season is upon us, but first we need to quickly recap what has happened to The Bulldogs in that past 2 games against private school opponents Seattle Prep and Lakeside. Wyatt Bare (Jr) got the start verse Prep, he went 6 inn's earned the win (4-2), allowing 2ER while striking out 7, Barty Hall (Sr) came in for relief and closed the Panthers out. Offensively, we collected 11 hits! (double digits), lead by Dashiell Story (So) 3-4 (at the plate), Liam Mahoney (Jr) 2-3 and Eli Herst (So) bases clearing double in the 1st inning.

Verse Lakeside Herst got the start, went 3 strong innings against the 2nd place Lions in the Mountain division, allowed 0 H, 4K and picked up the win (9-4). Offensively, once again Garfield recorded double digit hits (14 total), stars at the plate J.T. Wayne (Sr) had 2 hits that were both doubles and 2 RBI, Herst 3 hits (2 doubles), DJ Parker (Sr) 2 hits/2 runs/RBI and Spencer "the magician" Merwin (Fr) went 3 for 4, double and 3RBI's, all against one of Metro's 2024 top teams!

Stadium currently leads their 3A Pierce County conference with an undefeated record (perfect) @ 12-0. Coach Hinkle is looking to prepare for the playoffs ahead, looking for his team to continue their offensive and defensive ways. The Tigers are lead by Logan Judish (Sr) batting .434 with 23 hits/24 RBI. Defensively as a team they have a 0.961 F% (excellent for a high school team!)

Here come the 2024 Metro playoffs! Bulldogs will play a single elimination game against our neighborhood Quakers tomorrow @ SWAC 7:00pm, it's a must win game, the winner will be the #6 or #7 Sound seed playing May 1st @ Steve Cox field (all depends on which teams win). Coach Moe will have his Ace's ready to go on Friday, as you have a few days rest between initial playoff games.
